

**Call for Academic Visitors-PhD and Post-doctoral  
Law and the Humanities Hub at the Institute of Advanced Legal Studies (IALS),  
School of Advanced Study, University of London**

The Institute of Advanced Legal Studies at the School of Advanced Study, University of London invites applications from PhD and Post-doctoral researchers who are enthusiasts of Law and the Humanities, for visiting positions for the academic year 2024-2025. Visitors will be affiliated with a new Hub of Law and the Humanities (LHub) at IALS, become part of its founding collective, and contribute to its activity.

The visitorship is a unique opportunity to creatively imagine and shape work in Law and the Humanities as it implicates both academia and the general public, foster networks, and benefit from mentorship and shared involvement in your research.

Visitors will enjoy access to libraries and facilities at the School of Advanced Study, University of London, become part of the IALS community and remain LHub affiliates after their visitorship.

The visitorship position will be accompanied by an annual stipend of £1750 and travel reimbursement up to £500. It may be taken alongside any academic position in the UK or abroad.

The visitorship will include:

- Three to four LHub days at IALS every term, which will take place on Tuesdays or Thursdays during [term dates](#). Each day will be a mix of group sessions and dedicated research time in a common space. The first LHub day will take place on October 1, 2024, between 9:30 and 17:00.
- Significant contribution to one LHub project, to be discussed and agreed at the start of term. Some projects may exceed the tenure of visitorship and continue with the LHub affiliation.
